What is a rain garden?

It is a functional and aesthetic green space resembling a flowerbed used to capture runoff water from impermeable surfaces.

Requires little maintenance

Advantages

Replenishes the groundwater table

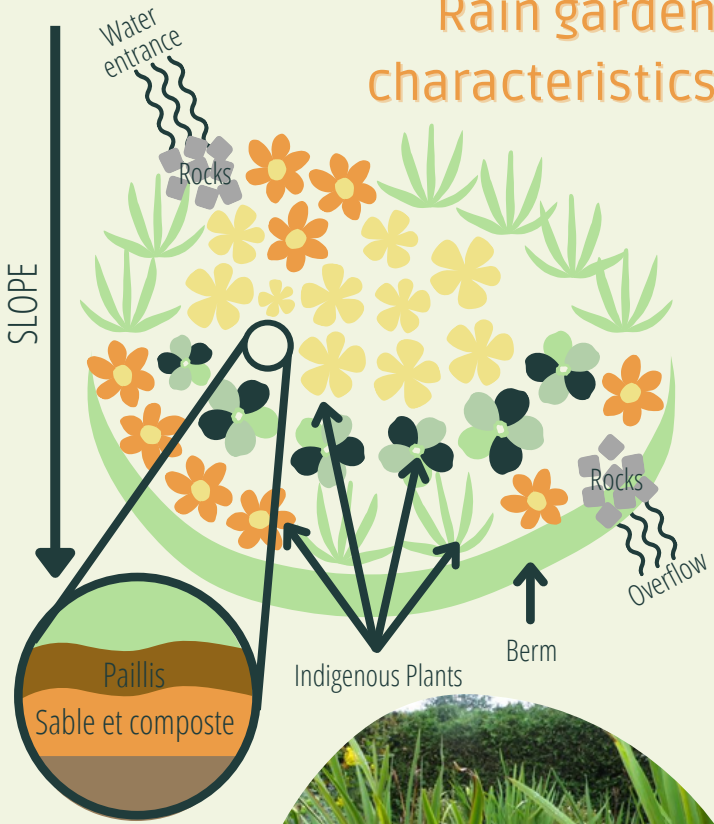
Serves as habitat for birds and insects

Reduces the effects of runoff

Requirements

- ✓ The soil must be percolative
- ✓ Must be built on a slope of <12%
- ✓ Must be installed away from house foundations, buried cables and pipes, or a septic tank

Rain garden characteristics



Rainwater percolates in 24 to 48 hours
